Regular Business Meeting
August 10, 2010

Jeff Hartman called the meeting to order. The minutes from the July 20, 2010, meeting were approved as read. Stephen Ayres opened the meeting in prayer.

TREASURER'S REPORT—The beginning balance in the checking account is \$7,975.12. Deposits during the month included a transfer from savings of \$8,500. Withdrawals to the account included a \$1,000 payment for the color guard clinic, a \$1,000 payment for the drum clinic, \$7,398.50 for the high school encampment, \$681.72 for the chili machine including the purchase of chili and cheese, \$667.40 to Coca Cola for the initial coke order, and \$524.04 for the purchase of a freezer. The beginning balance in the savings account is \$9,547.64. Deposits included interest income of \$2.12. There was a transfer of \$8,500 to checking. The closing balance in the savings account is \$1,049.76. Jeff Hartman made a motion that the treasurer's report be approved as read and entered into the minutes.

COMMITTEE REPORTS—Chris Lee expressed his appreciation to those who showed up for the concessions workshop. The freezer has not yet been delivered. Chris stated he is looking at ordering from Sysco. He hopes to get prices from them later this week. He stated sign up for football games has been dismal. Chris stated he would use a separate sign up for students for the Tuesday/Thursday games. He stated he would limit the number of students used at these games. With Mr. Tipton's approval, he would like to give everyone a chance to sign up, so everyone has an opportunity to participate.

Dawn Hartman reported there would be a car wash in the parking lot at ProMiles Saturday, August 14.

The March-A-Thon will be Saturday, October 30.

OLD BUSINESS—Chris Lee reported that several months ago Jeff Hartman approached administration regarding the installation of the carport donated by The Ayres. We have been informed that the district will not utilize "used" material, so the cover for area behind the concession stand is being tabled.

Jeff Hartman stated that the practice stand has been completed. He added they would be adding better wheels to the pods and painting.

The district has stated the purchase of the ice machine will be postponed until the new budget year, which will open September 15.

Jeff Hartman stated the concession stand workday went well.

Jeff stated Band Booster information has been given to Mr. Tipton for the band handbook.

NEW BUSINESS—Emily Lee asked the cost of trailer sponsorships. It was stated the cost was \$2,500 for a large space and \$1,250 for the smaller spaces. The spaces are for a two-year period. For a one-year period they could be sold for half-price.

Jeff Hartman stated it has been determined that, with work, the old golf cart could be made to run and what would we like to do about the cart. After brief discussion, it was decided to list on Southeast Texas.com for \$1,500 or best offer, cash only.

Jeff stated one of the items recently worked on at a recent Board workshop was a new shirt design. Different suppliers were discussed.

Gina Cessac asked about the tax-exempt status. It was stated we are still trying to get all the details in order.

With no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned. The next meeting will be the potluck dinner on September 14.
